Shepherds, Shepherds, and more Shepherds

Christian Care Centers' heritage is rich with shepherds the Lord has used in this ministry. Shepherds such as Ben Yeakley, an elder in Gainesville and one of our first Board members, who was instrumental in starting the Gunter Home for the Aged in 1947, Ben's son, Flavil Yeakley, Sr., a minister for the Saner Avenue Church, and Homer P. Reeves, minister for the Sunset Church, who did most of the promotional work to open the Home for the Aged. And then, to make three generations of shepherding, Ben's grandson, Flavil Yeakley, Jr., became minister for the congregation in Gunter, as well as Flavil, Jr.'s other grandfather, W. G. Klingman, who became office manager. Another key shepherd from that era was the Home's superintendent, Ralph Godfrey - all shepherds overseeing the flock that became Hilltop Haven.

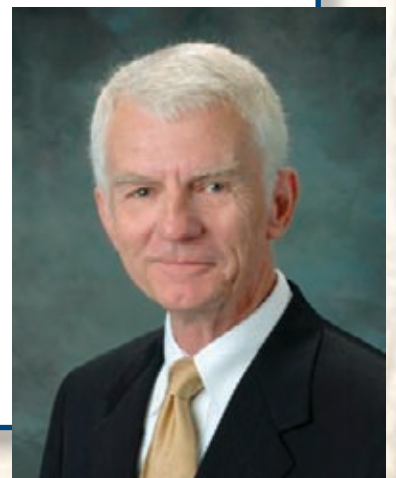
Gunter Home for the Aged also became known for its resident shepherds. Belle Reynolds, a blind sister, was a great poet and speaker, Brother Ayers, who, even though crippled with rheumatoid arthritis, persisted to become a gifted artist, and Tillit S. Teddlie, known to everyone in the brotherhood for his inspirational hymns.

And are there modern-day shepherds, you ask? Absolutely! And we will talk about them in subsequent issues of *Herald of Hope*.

Shepherds, it's all of us. We all have spheres of influence. We need to pray for wisdom and strength to walk in the footsteps of Jesus Christ, the great good Shepherd. Our Shepherds' Heritage

Heritage – a word depicting something that has been handed down from a predecessor - a predecessor who had the faith, wisdom, and foresight to create something worth passing down. Christian Care Centers is, indeed, most fortunate to be the beneficiary of such. Can any endeavor have a better premise for its creation than “helping people who have given their lives to the work of the Lord?” We think not. And that is exactly the reason why Christian Care Centers was created - created by men and women who gave entirely of themselves to a cause like none other. It all began in March 1947 when our founding shepherds formed a non-profit corporation known as The Home for the Aged. Board Appointees

At its December 2007 Annual Meeting, the Board of Trustees of Christian Care Centers elected John Scott Vice Chairman. Mr. Scott has served on the Board for fourteen years. Mr. Scott, a native of Madison, Tennessee and a graduate of David Lipscomb University and Abilene Christian University, is the Minister of the Saturn Road Church of Christ in Garland, Texas, where he has served for sixteen years. He is on the Board of Christian Works for Children and is an adjunct professor for Amberton University.

At its December 2007 Annual Meeting, the Board of Trustees of Christian Care Centers elected Harold D. Tidwell Chairman of the Board. Mr. Tidwell has served on the Board of Trustees for eleven years – four years as Vice Chairman, and, most recently, as Interim Chairman. Mr. Tidwell is a native of Dallas and a graduate of South Oak Cliff High School. Mr. Tidwell retired in 1998 from The Southland Corporation, where he had served for 29 years. Mr. Tidwell has had ten members of his or his wife's family live at one of Christian Care Centers' communities. As a young boy, Mr. Tidwell helped his father and other church members volunteer with construction projects for Home for the Aged, now Hilltop Haven in Gunter, Texas.

TILLIT S. TEDDLIE 1885-1987

Brother Teddlie was born June 3, 1885 in Swan, Texas, the 8th of 9 children. He attended his first singing school at age 9. He was educated at Southern Development Normal in Waco, Texas, a school for advanced instruction in theory and harmony, and attended the University of North Texas. He taught in singing schools for 61 years, and served as superintendent of Boles Home from 1927-1929. He led singing for more than 100 gospel preachers in meetings all across the country. Teddlie celebrated his 102nd birthday on June 3, 1987 at Hilltop Haven in Gunter, Texas, where he had lived for several

RALPH GODFREY 1910-1994

Before "Home for the Aged," now Hilltop Haven, opened in 1947, the founding superintendent, Ralph Godfrey, was communicating to area churches and members about its Biblical Mission, "caring for widows" and elderly preachers who needed care. Brother Godfrey also printed the first *Herald of Hope* in 1947, which has continued for 58 years. Brother Godfrey was known for his straightforward approach to fundraising. He never asked that anyone discontinue any of their benevolent giving to other Christian projects, but just reminded them that they could always add one more to their list – Hilltop Haven.



years. He passed away on August 17. He will be forever remembered for the more than 30 songs he composed, which have been published in more song books than can be counted.

DR. E. W. MCMILLAN 1889-1991

Born in 1889, Brother McMillan preached his first sermon in 1909 at the Ballinger Church of Christ, and never stopped for 80 years. He served



as pulpit minister at the University Church of Christ in Lubbock from 1928-34, and served churches in Waco, Cleburne, Fort Worth, and Lubbock, Texas, in Nashville and Memphis, Tennessee, and Santa Ana and Whittier, California. He founded the Ibaraki Christian College in Japan and helped found Southwestern Christian College in Terrell, Texas. In 1989, the Christian Care Centers, Inc. Board of Trustees named its newest retirement apartment complex, where Brother McMillan had lived for several years, "McMillan Place" in honor and tribute to him. Brother McMillan exemplified all the admirable qualities of a Christian. His example, professional accomplishment Christian leadership, and love for all mankind have been chronicled in most of the Christian and numerous national publications.

Our Heritage

VIRGIL BENTLEY 1919-2004

Virgil Bentley could respectfully be called “Mr. Christian Care Centers.” His association with Christian Care Centers began in the late 1960s, when a “modern Christian nursing home in the Dallas area” was just a dream. For almost 40 more years, Brother Bentley served Christian Care Centers as an accomplished speaker and writer, planner and developer, speaker and fund raiser, student of Gerontology, receiving a Master of Arts from the University of North Texas, interim Administrator, Editor of the *Herald of Hope*, member of the Board of Trustees and later Senior Board for 25 years, and first minister of the Christian Care Center Church of Christ, ultimately serving for 30 years.



ELMER MORGAN 1928-2006

Elmer Morgan was a pulpit minister for 60 years, baptizing over 1,000 people, and wrote and published more than 30 books. He began his ministry as a young teenager in Tennessee and continued in Miami, Florida (8 years), the Urbandale congregation in Dallas, Military Parkway (19 years), and the Rockwall congregation (20 years), where, after retiring, remained in the position of Assistant Minister. In 2004, Brother Morgan and his wife, Edith, moved to McMillan Apartments on the Christian Care Centers campus in Mesquite, where he began his magnanimous work in Ministerial Services. He was instrumental in forming the Christian Care Center Veterans Club, which has grown into a viable contributor to campus projects.

DR. BILLY RAY COX 1935-2007

Dr. Cox served on the Christian Care Center Board of Trustees since 1992 and as Chairman since 2003. A native Texan, Dr. Cox attended Harding University in Searcy, Arkansas, Southern Methodist University, and Harvard Business School. He was a CPA by profession, and later served Harding University for 15 years in several roles, including Executive Vice President. After 14 years as Chief Executive Officer of Dal-Tile, he retired to devote his time and talent to help organizations about which he cared deeply, including Christian Care



Centers, Saturn Road Church of Christ where he served as Elder, international Christian mission efforts, and Dallas Christian Schools. He often told those he loved and cared for, “Now, remember what you know for sure!”, meaning God loved them and he loved them, too.
